An Introduction to Legacy Sunday

What is Legacy Sunday?

Legacy Sunday is a special day in the life of your parish dedicated to honoring the faithful stewards who have remembered the Church in their estate plans and encourage others to leave a legacy gift of faith through the Idaho Catholic Foundation to their parish/ministry. It's a time to reflect on the blessings we've received and consider how we can leave a lasting legacy of faith for future generations.

Why Legacy Giving Matters

Your legacy gift is a powerful expression of faith. It ensures that your parish can continue its mission of worship, education, outreach, and service for years to come. Whether through a bequest in your will, a gift of life insurance, or a retirement account designation, your planned gift provides long-term support that helps sustain the Church's ministries beyond your lifetime.

How Parishioners Can Leave a Legacy of Faith

On Legacy Sunday, we recognize current legacy donors and invite parishioners of all ages to prayerfully consider how they might support the future of your parish. By including the Idaho Catholic Foundation in your will, trust, or estate plan restricted for your parish, school, or favorite ministry, you ensure that your faith continues to bear fruit. The Idaho Catholic Foundation partners with individuals and families to create legacy gifts that support Catholic parishes, ministries, and missions throughout the Diocese of Boise.

Legacy Gifts Can Include:

- A bequest in your will or trust
- Naming the parish or ministry as a beneficiary of a retirement plan or life insurance policy
- Establishing a donor-advised or endowment fund with the Idaho Catholic Foundation

Why are we conducting Legacy Sunday in November?

• November is the month we pray to the Saints and remember our loved ones who have passed. It's a time for us to reflect on our own Catholic legacy—the **spiritual** and **material** impact we leave on this world.

- November is the month we reflect with gratitude on God's generosity as a nation.
- November is the beginning of the holiday season and when people gather with family and loved ones, providing an opportunity to talk about their Catholic legacy with them.

Who are the key players in a successful Legacy Sunday?

- Pastor
- Staff or volunteer who work on stewardship directives
- Staff or volunteer who work on communications, including the bulletin, social media, and website
- A legacy liaison or donor who has made a planned gift (a gift made in a will/trust or estate plan)
- Staff or volunteer who are willing to coordinate the initiative



Communications Timeline & Instructions for Legacy Sunday (LS)

Three weeks prior

Add to your parish website "Legacy Planning" linking to Idaho Catholic Foundation (www.IdahoCatholicFoundation.org)

The Idaho Catholic Foundation "Giving" drop down menu includes Legacy Giving, Endowment Funds, Donor Advised Fund, Wills/Trust and Estate Planning. Also, there is a "Legacy Sunday" drop down menu that includes "Resources for Parishioners" and "Resources for Parishes".

- Display (optional) LS Banner in church foyer/entrance
- Make Legacy Sunday brochures and pencils available in pews
- Father's homily reflects on Legacy Sunday: See Homily Help

- Collect any returned tear off reply cards from brochure and mail to Development Office for follow-up

Homily Help for Legacy Sunday

Leaving a Lasting Legacy

We are all building a legacy—whether we realize it or not. The question isn't *if* we'll leave a legacy, but *what kind* of legacy we'll leave behind.

St. Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 15:58:

"Be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor in the Lord is not in vain."

The work we do for God—the way we love, serve, and give—echoes into eternity.

Each of us is here today because someone shared the faith with us. A parent, grandparent, friend, teacher, or priest passed it on. If they hadn't, would we be sitting here? Christianity is always just one generation away from disappearing—and that's why it's our turn now.

We must pass on the most important truths: not wealth, achievements, or possessions—but **faith**, **hope**, and **love**.

1 Corinthians 13:13 says these three will last forever.

And how do we express them? Through generosity.

Did you know the word "give" appears in the Bible more than **2,200 times**—more than faith, hope, and love *combined*? Why? Because **generosity is faith in action**. It's hope made visible. It's love with hands and feet.

So, we must ask: *Is my legacy one of generosity?*

Scripture is full of legacy-builders—Moses, David, Paul. People whose impact lasted long after their lives ended. Take Moses: Deuteronomy says there was never again a prophet in Israel like him. Yet he didn't just leave laws—he left behind a people prepared to follow God.

And that's the invitation for us too. Not to be remembered for our titles or trophies, but for the people we formed, the faith we passed on, and the love we gave.

Psalm 78:4 says:

"We will not hide these truths from our children; we will tell the next generation about the glorious deeds of the Lord."


That's a legacy. Telling the story. Living the story. Giving others the story.

Maybe you wonder: Have I failed too many times? Is it too late?

The answer is no. You're still breathing. You're still building. And heaven is still writing your story.

So here are five simple ways to leave a godly legacy:

- 1. Fear the Lord and obey Him your legacy starts in your heart.
- 2. Let God work through you it's His power that leaves the deepest mark.



In the end, reputation is what people think of you now. **Legacy is what they remember long after you're gone.** Most of us won't leave statues or biographies. But we can leave something greater: changed lives, encouraged hearts, and a witness to God's love that keeps going.

So, what can you do today, to build that kind of legacy tomorrow?

Let us live generously. Let us love deeply. And let us pass on a faith that lasts forever.

As part of Legacy Sunday, I invite you to prayerfully consider including your parish in your will or estate plans. Of course, we begin by taking care of our families—that's both natural and faithful. But once your loved ones are provided for, consider including the Church as one of your children—a part of your family that has nurtured your soul, formed your values, and walked with you through life.

Your gift can ensure that the faith you've lived continues to flourish—for your children, their children, and all those who will come after.

Because your legacy—rooted in Christ—can be a light that never goes out.

Talking Points for Lay Leaders -**Legacy Sunday**

1. Introduction

- Introduce yourself and your connection to the parish.
- Briefly explain that today you're here to speak about the future of the parish long after we're gone.

2. Why Legacy Sunday?

- Legacy Sunday is a special weekend to encourage parishioners to prayerfully consider including the church in their will or estate plans.
- It's about ensuring the parish remains vibrant and financially supported for future generations.

3. The Power of Legacy

- Legacy is more than money it's about values, faith, and spiritual impact.
- Reference Scripture: Jesus entrusted us with His legacy the Eucharist. We, too, are called to pass on what has shaped our faith.

4. Personal Testimony (Customize this to the speaker's experience)

- Share a memory of the parish: baptisms, weddings, funerals, or a time when the parish supported you.
- Talk about a legacy gift that made a visible difference (e.g., a new roof, scholarships, or youth ministry support).
- Explain how including the parish in your will is a way to say thank you to God and His Church.

5. Practical Steps

- Let parishioners know there are free tools available: estate planning guides, funeral planning resources, consultations with the Idaho Catholic Foundation.
- No gift is too small even a small percentage of a life insurance policy or retirement account can have a lasting impact.

6. Call to Action

- Encourage parishioners to pick up a brochure, return the response form, or scan the QR code to learn more.
- Ask them to pray about it this is a spiritual decision just as much as a financial one.

Sample 5-Minute Presentation for Legacy Sunday (Lay Leader)

Good morning/afternoon, everyone.

For those of you who don't know me, my name is [Insert Name], and I've been a member of [Parish Name] for [X] years. I've raised my family here. I've watched my children receive their sacraments here. This church has been the backdrop of some of the most sacred moments in my life — from joyful celebrations to moments of deep sorrow and prayer.

And because of their generosity, I worship under a roof that doesn't leak. My children/grandchildren enjoy Vacation Bible School. Our youth group has a place to gather.

I invite you today to pray about your legacy. Stop by the display in the back of church. Pick up the brochure sitting in your pew. Talk to your family.




